



Autumn House
Residential Supports Level 1-4

Description: Autumn House will provides this service to meet the habilitation and personal care needs of I/DD consumers who wish to live in a group setting. Autumn House provides assistance with acquisition, retention, or improvement in skills related to activities of daily living, such as personal grooming and cleanliness, bed making and household chores, eating and the preparation of food, and the social and adaptive skills necessary to enable the individual to reside in a non-institutional setting. Habilitation, training and instruction are coupled with elements of support, supervision and engaging participation to reflect the natural flow of training, practice of skills, and other activities as they occur during the course of the consumer's day. This service also provides assistance, support, supervision, and monitoring that allow individuals to participate in home or community activities. Individuals living in Autumn House may use this service to provide habilitation and support in community living activities such as shopping and leisure activities in the community.

Philosophy: Our staff is concerned that each individual achieve their highest level of independence with whatever assistance is necessary. Toward that end, each individual works with their team to set goals that they would like to achieve. We are looking to provide a safe, healthy, productive, and happy life for each person that chooses to live with us.

Program Goals: This service is distinctive in that it includes habilitation and training activities, as well as care and assistance with activities of daily living when the individual is dependent on others to ensure health and safety. Interactions with the consumer are designed to achieve outcomes identified in the Plan of Care. Support and supervision of the person's activities to sustain skills gained through habilitation and training are some of the goals of Autumn House.

Service Modalities: Residential Supports is a blended service that includes habilitation, personal care, and support; therefore, all areas shall be addressed. Autumn house does not do ANY physical restraints or seclusion and is not a locked facility.

Population Served: We serve adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities from North Carolina. Currently, all of our residents are multi-handicapped, having either a physical disability or a mental illness in addition to a developmental disability. We are a co-ed facility.

Resources: Residential Supports can be provided in licensed residential settings of 6 beds or less. This service is typically paid through the Innovations Waiver but private pay arrangements can be made.

CARF Accredited Service: Community Services: Community Housing

Service Definition Requirements: Staff must demonstrate client specific competencies as identified by the individual’s person-centered planning team and documented in the plan of care. Staff must meet the requirements for paraprofessionals in 10A NCAC 27G.0200 Direct care staff must have a criminal record check, a healthcare registry check, and their driving record must be checked if staff is providing transportation. Supervision by a Qualified Professional must be provided according to supervision requirements specified in 10A NCAC 27G.0204 and according to licensure or certification requirements of the appropriate discipline

Service Limitations – Payments for Residential Support are not made for room and board; do not include payments made, directly or indirectly, to members of the individual’s immediate family – immediate family in this instance means parent or stepparent of a minor child, or spouse. Payments will not be made for the routine care and supervision that would be expected to be provided by a family or group home provider, or for activities or supervision for which a payment is made by a source other than Medicaid. Residential Supports may not be provided at the same time of day that a person receives: Adult Day health, Day Supports, the community component of Home and Community Supports, Respite, Supported Employment, or Transportation. The community component of Home and Community Supports may be used with Residential Supports only to meet the day programming needs of individuals who have chosen not to receive their day programming needs through a licensed facility.

In addition, individuals who receive Residential Supports may not receive State Plan Adult Care Personal Care Services or waiver Personal Care Services since personal care components are included in the Residential Supports service definition.
